

STATE OF THE CITY HIGHLIGHTS ASSETS, ACCOMPLISHMENTS, ANTICIPATED FISCAL PRIORITIES

On Thursday, April 21, the City of Indian Wells presented its first live-streamed State of the City address, the City Council shared updates with Residents watching both in person and from afar. During the one-hour presentation, the past year's advancements and future priorities were outlined, highlighted by the following:

- Public safety is the City's top priority, and the past year has seen the lowest Indian Wells property crime rate in a decade. The Indian Wells Police Department has made strategic use of data and enforcement to achieve a 32% decrease in traffic collisions, and the Indian Wells Fire Department has maintained a 3.5-minute average response time for service calls.
- The City has again maintained annual revenue above expenses, with the past fiscal year's expenses at \$16.1 million versus revenue of \$16.4 million.
- City leaders recently conducted a 10-year forecast of future budgets. The City may have modest financial challenges in coming years if costs for contracts such as the County Sheriff and County Fire Department are not contained. Those services had increases in cost by 7.5% and 6% respectively this year. This issue is shared by many cities in the region, and City leaders are working collectively with our neighbors to find solutions



- The BNP Paribas Open attracted more than 400,000 attendees and brought in \$2.7 million in City ticket tax for 2015. Planned Tennis Garden improvements include an extensive update to Stadium 1.
- A year of conservation efforts is paying off. The City is at 100% compliance in its usage of nonpotable water at City properties.

- Making the City's award-winning golf resort financially self-sufficient was another goal for 2017. Troon Golf has conducted recent strategic planning sessions to build a road map toward this self-sufficiency in the next 18 months.
- To increase dining business, VUE has launched a new themed buffet for the last Tuesday of each month. The cost is \$15 for Residents and \$22 for non-residents and Resident Benefit Cards may be used. Happy hour beverage pricing will also be offered for the 4 to 7 p.m. event.
- The City is working with local hotel properties to help promote the appeal, amenities and desirability of the golf resort.
- The City is targeting business development as another key priority. There are 10 undeveloped properties in the city, including the 2.6-acre restaurant and retail center planned at Washington Street and Miles Avenue, south of the Tennis Garden.

Indian Wells Golf Resort to Play Key Role in Troon Challenge


2016 MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY

This event is open to all, no RSVP is required, and light refreshments will be served. Please join us for this moving tribute to those who have given their lives in service to their country.

How We Honor the U.S. Flag

The City of Indian Wells follows a formal policy for displaying the American flag, in honor of holidays and to recognize the passing of government officials, current and former City officials, and current and former City employees. In compliance with the United States Flag Code and etiquette, City Hall flies the American flag daily. The flag is flown at half-staff on Peace Officer's Memorial Day (May 15), Memorial Day (May 30), Patriot Day (September 11), and Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (December 7). The flag may also be flown at half-staff when the U.S. president, state governor, or federal agency department head proclaims a period of mourning. On a local note, in 1954 U.S. President Dwight D. Eisenhower — a part-time Indian Wells resident – issued a proclamation on the proper times to fly the flag at half-staff. Here in Indian Wells, to recognize the passing of government officials and current and former City Council members and City staff, the City Manager or his/ her designee shall declare that black Mourning Ribbons be placed at the top of the flagpole just below the finial or ornament, with the American flag flying at full-staff.

Swimming Pool Safety Tips

With warm weather here and swimming pools a popular gathering spot, those involved with the supervision of children should be aware of the dangers associated with any body of water. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately one in five people who die from drowning are children 14 and younger -- with children ages one to four having the highest drowning rates.

Here are some key tips to prevent these needless tragedies:

- Never leave small children alone and unsupervised — even for a few seconds. Know how to swim, and always have a "designated child watcher" who can swim too.
- If a child is missing, check the pool first. Go to the edge of the pool and scan the entire pool, bottom and surface, as well as the pool area.
- Anyone watching children should learn CPR and be able to rescue a child if needed.
- Do not use flotation devices as a substitute for supervision.
- Even if young children have had swimming lessons, they must be watched closely while they are swimming.
- Use an approved barrier to separate the pool from the house.

- ♦ Have life-saving devices near the pool, such as a pole/hook or flotation device.
- Keep children away from pool filters, as the suction force may injure them or prevent them from surfacing.
- If you leave the pool area, take the children with you.
- Keep large objects such as tables, chairs, toys and ladders away from pool fences. Do not allow children to play around the pool, and store all toys outside the pool area.
 - Never swim alone, or while under the influence of alcohol or medications.
 - Never swim during storms with thunder and/or lightning.
 - Check the pool area regularly for glass bottles, toys or other potential accident hazards.
 - Keep CD players, radios, tablets, smartphones, laptops, and other electrical devices away from pools or nearby wet surfaces.
 - ♦ For above-ground pools, steps and ladders to the pool should be secured and locked, or removed when the pool is not in use.
 - Never dive into unfamiliar or shallow bodies of water.
 - Don't swim if you're tired or have just finished eating.
 - Post the 9-1-1 emergency number on all phones.




