




Music For Scholars Concert Set For November 11


unheralded minority women backup singers.

Business License Renewals Are Due by Year-End



The City of Indian Wells requires that anyone conducting a business service or contracting work within the City obtain a business license. This also pertains to all contractors, sub-contractors, short-term rentals, mobile businesses, landscape companies and massage therapists.

- All contractors must have a current, valid contractor's license with the Contractors State License Board.
- Anyone selling products must have a state seller's permit.
- If a fictitious business name is used, it must be filed through the County of Riverside.
- If a partnership, corporation, trust or limited liability corporation owns the business, you must provide a federal D number
- If you are a sole proprietor, you must provide a federal ID number.
- If you have employees, you must provide a state ID number
- If you operate a business that is licensed by a state agency, you must provide your state license number and a copy of the state contractor card.

City of Indian Wells business licenses must be renewed at the end of each calendar year. Complete guidelines and applications can be obtained online at www.cityofindianwells.org (I WANT TO...Apply for Business Licenses) or from the Business License Division at Indian Wells City Hall Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (closed for lunch 12-1 p.m.), excluding holidays. You may also call the Division at (760) 346-2489 to request an application via mail, e-mail or fax. Be sure to ask about any changes for 2017 online applications.

The Joslyn Center is offering three workshops and seminars on topics of timely interest to Indian Wells residents. The free events will cover the following:


- Benefits of Technology Seminar: October 21, 9 a.m. to noon

INDIAN WELLS ARTS FESTIVAL GETS HIGH SCORES

Sunshine Artist magazine has issued its annual audit of California arts festivals, and the Indian Wells Arts Festival has received exceptional scores from auditors as well as event participants — one of whom said, "This is the best organized show I have ever participated in. They are great at taking care of us artists... and the venue can't be beat." Event scores were consistently high across all festival categories, including a rare industry score of 9.0 out of 10 for judging and awards. Layout and load-in/load-out scored even higher at 9.4, while parking was ranked very favorably at 9.6. In the report, auditors agreed that quality and balance of work were highly present at the 2016 show, giving these categories scores of 9.4 each, while the overall prestige of the event was rated a noteworthy 9.6. One hundred percent of Sunshine Artist auditors recommend coming back to the Indian Wells Arts Festival, citing another artist as saying, "This is my favorite show." Artist management and artist treatment, in fact, scored 9.8 out of 10.
