

Hyatt Regency Employee Helps Motorists in Need After Accident

On March 6, Agua Serena Spa employee **Rachel Godek** left the Hyatt Regency Indian Wells Resort and Spa after work as usual. While waiting to turn left onto Fred Waring Drive from Eldorado, she witnessed a car accident when a car that appeared to run a red light violently struck another car starting a left turn in the turning lane. Although initially in shock, Godek immediately responded at



the scene, assisting a 90-year-old man, and his son with his two daughters out of the damaged car and to safety. Thankfully, no one was injured although the elderly man was quite shaken up and the family wanted him evaluated at a hospital.

Not only did Godek stay with them until police and the ambulance arrived, doing her best to calm and comfort them, she transported the father and two daughters to Desert Regional Medical Center to accompany the

ambulance transport. During an experience that was traumatic for all involved, Godek did all she could to offer the hospitality and kindness that the family needed. In fact, the family now refers to Godek as their "guardian angel" and she has kept in touch with them via text to continually check on their well-being. Understandably, Godek was emotional and distressed after the incident, but has come to a place of gratitude for being able to be there for the family.

"It's reaffirmed my belief to keep my focus on enjoying every minute and not taking things for granted," Godek says.

We applaud Godek for her heroism, kindness and compassion.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT JOSLYN CENTER

Did you know that the Joslyn Center offers a Meals on Wheels program and a food pantry? Joslyn Center delivers an average of 75 meals daily with more than 19,000 meals served annually to area seniors. The Meals on Wheels program service area includes Indian Wells, Rancho Mirage, Palm Desert and Sun City in Palm Desert. The program also offers frozen meals for weekends and holidays, and meals for pets.

Penny's Pantry, the Joslyn Center's food pantry, has served approximately 2,750 individuals since the pantry started in 2011. The pantry is open from 7:30-9:30 a.m. on the first and third Fridays of every month.

Compost enriches soil and can reduce the need for water.

This special educational event is free and open to the public. No RSVP required. Low-cost backyard composting bins will be available for purchase.

Residential Earthquake Planning

The most important action you can take in the event of a major earthquake is to develop an action plan in advance and prepare by obtaining all the supplies you will need to be self-sufficient for at least three to five days after a major temblor strikes.

If you live alone, establish an emergency plan with relatives, friends, co-workers or a community-based organization. Families should plan to share responsibility and work as a team. Knowing what to do when disaster strikes is your best protection.



Personal Planning

- Know your environment. Determine the safe spots in each room, such as under sturdy tables, desks or against inside walls. Also, know the danger spots including windows, mirrors, hanging objects, fireplaces, and tall furniture.
- Conduct practice drills by physically placing yourself and your children in safe locations.
- Fasten large shelves and furniture securely to walls.
- Teach all family members how to shut off gas, water and electricity in case the lines are damaged.
- Always know the alternative exits for your home and workplace in emergency situations.
- Have disaster supplies readily available including emergency food, water, medicines, protective clothing, battery operated radio or television, and first aid kit.
- Learn first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) from your local Red Cross chapter or other community organization. (The City of Indian Wells offers free CPR classes for residents during select months.)













- Decide where your family will reunite if separated. Make sure that young children learn to recite or write their names, parents' or guardian's names, and their phone number and address.
- Create a neighborhood plan. Identify neighbors who have special needs or will require assistance.
- Develop an emergency communications plan. Keep a list of emergency phone numbers and instruct all family members on how and when to call 911 and other emergency services.
- If indoors during an earthquake, remember to DROP to the ground, take COVER by getting under a sturdy table or other piece of furniture, and HOLD ON until the shaking stops. If there isn't a table or desk near you, cover your face and head with your arms and crouch in an inside corner of the building.

The City of Indian Wells Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is located next to the fire station adjacent to City Hall. The telephone number when the EOC is activated during a major disaster is (760) 773-6655.






