City Hall to Continue Strategic Planning at the Start of the New Year

As we welcome two new Council members this month, City Council and staff will be convening this winter in a number of strategic planning sessions to develop a comprehensive blueprint for City objectives and action plans in the short- and long-term.

This master plan encompasses effectively establishing goals for the upcoming budget cycle, and creating ways that the City—together with the Indian Wells community—can work together to pinpoint issues, collaborate to find the most successful solutions, and achieve an exceptional level of trust and transparency.

As always, City Council and staff's top priority is to represent the Indian Wells community. This coming year, we are setting the bar higher than ever in our pledge to really listen to what you, our citizens, need and want.

Consequently, we encourage you to attend City Council meetings, watch them online if you can't attend, and participate in the Virtual Town Hall online

forum. We encourage you to use the Virtual Town Hall forum often as we present new issues to share your comments and opinions. We plan to tackle real problems and, as we do so, ensure that money is wisely spent through a fair public process that maintains the highest standards and in which all opinions are considered.

City Council and staff are fully invested in using 'best practices' in local governance so that everyone who lives in, works in, and visits Indian Wells has access to top-notch services and lifestyle amenities.

Please plan to attend the City's Strategic Planning workshop on February 11-12, 2015. Right after the first of the year, you'll have an opportunity to provide input on goals and direction you deem important for our community on the Virtual Town Hall forum.

Virtual Town Hall: Art in Public Places

The City wants to hear your opinion:

Art in Public Places fees are used to support public art throughout cities in California. These funds come from developer fees consistent with State law that are imposed on commercial and residential projects. State law requires the City of Indian Wells to use these fees to construct public art within a five-year time frame.

The current Art in Public Places fund balance available to create public art is approximately \$350,000. The City is using Art in Public Places funds to create the Carl Bray monument, which is expected to be completed by June 2015. The City Council has targeted the remaining funds for an Art in Public Places project at Cook and Highway 111.



We want your feedback. The project includes the northeast and southeast corners of Highway 111 and Cook Street. The northeast corner currently has a portion of the original date palm tree grove, while the southeast corner includes a green belt with palm trees, and is a part of the Province development.

The City has discussed this item on many occasions and it is the Council's goal to move the project forward. Many options have been discussed including a historical theme, water features and pedestrian amenities. At this time the City Council is seeking creative ideas from Indian Wells residents for an Art in Public Places project at the corner of Highway 111 and Cook Street. What kind of project do you think will enhance the site and also visually identify our beautiful Indian Wells community?

Please note that this Virtual Town Hall forum topic will be open for comment until December 31, 2014 at which time City staff will organize all the comments to present to the City Council.

A reminder to please keep your feedback here to this particular topic. You will be able to post your original comment and add subsequent comments to the same thread.

If this is your first comment on the Virtual Town Hall forum, you will be asked for your name and home address. This confidential information is only used to identify statements from residents in and near Indian Wells so that participants know which statements are from local residents. You have the ability to keep your comments anonymous if you so choose.

Visit a Valley Treasure

In 1941, intrepid pioneer and traveler Cabot Yerxa began building his Hopi-inspired residence in Desert Hot Springs. Today this multi-level pueblo made from salvaged materials is known as Cabot's Pueblo Museum. Now on the National Register of Historic Places, it's one of the most fascinating attractions in the Coachella Valley.

The City's Community Activities Committee has planned an exclusive Indian Wells resident excursion to Cabot's Pueblo Museum on Monday, January 19, 2015 beginning at 12 p.m.

After the museum tour there will be a lunch option available for purchase. After lunch, residents will tour the museum interior in groups of 12, giving ample time to those waiting for the next tour to spend time on the grounds, and within the Trading Post/Gallery.

Residents are responsible for their own transportation to and from the museum—carpooling is encouraged. Participants should also be able-bodied as there will be walking and stair climbing. Don't Give 'Em a Helping Hand...



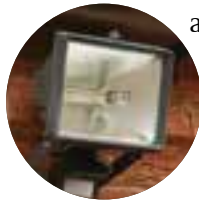
Did you know a burglary (or breaking and entering as some like to call it) is reported in the United States every 15 seconds? The NUMBER 1 thing thieves look for is "ease of access." The easier a location or vehicle is as a target, the easier the completion of the crime and the less chance of getting caught. The police are constantly trying to minimize "crimes of opportunity," or a crime committed without planning. I have spoken to several security teams within the city where their force does a great job of reminding people to close their garages at night and lock their car doors if they park outside. Through all of our reminders in the public safety community, that "15 second" statistic still often applies to the people that let it occur. As I reviewed crime data from the prior month, overwhelmingly any thefts that occurred were due to unlocked houses and cars. We have some of the most beautiful homes in the entire region—don't give thieves a hand in creating a "crime of opportunity." Take the time to install and utilize exterior lighting on your home.



Automatic timers for your home's interior lighting when you are away is an exceptional deterrent from prying eyes.



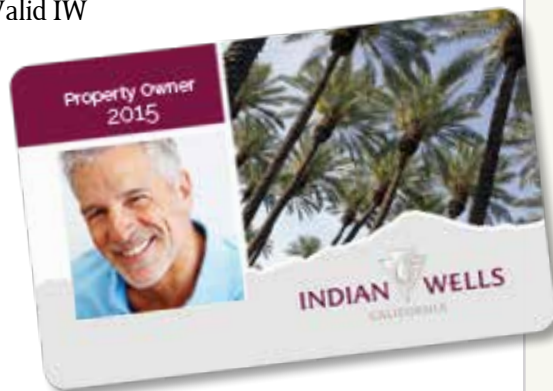
Above all, and an easy habit to create, do that final walk around the house/cars at night before bed and ensure things are locked up, as I DON'T want you giving thieves a helping hand.

Renew Your Property Owner ID Card Online or at City Hall

Just a reminder that you can now begin the online renewal process to receive your 2015 IW Property Owner ID card by visiting the Residents section at www.cityofindianwells.org. However, if you are a new property owner, first-time cardholder or wish to take a new photo for your renewal card, you must apply in person at City Hall (Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-12 p.m. or 1-5 p.m.). Please bring a recorded grant deed or other valid proof of property ownership. Valid IW Property Owner ID cards are required to access most of the Indian Wells resident benefits, which you can also view online in the Residents section.

BNP PARIBAS OPEN ECONOMIC IMPACT SURPASSES \$373 MILLION

A recent study conducted by George Washington University revealed that the March 2014 BNP Paribas Open generated an estimated total gross economic impact on the Coachella Valley regional economy of \$373,898,629. This represents a 29% increase since 2011 when the University conducted the last economic impact study.



money spent by out-of-town visitors, vendors, sponsors, and the tournament organization to a business in the region. Indirect and induced impact is the re-spending of this money by the regional businesses in the regional economy.

Total gross economic impact is derived by calculating the direct (\$238,151,993) and indirect and induced (\$135,746,636) economic impacts and then adding them together to show the incremental spending above and beyond what would have been expected had the BNP Paribas Open not been held in the area. The study also examined the impact that the

construction of the new Stadium 2 and renovations to the Indian Wells Tennis Garden had on the local economy, and when this is factored into the equation, the gross economic impact rose to \$417,624,972.

A total of 431,527 people attended the 2014 BNP Paribas Open over the two-week period, an increase from 350,086 in 2011.

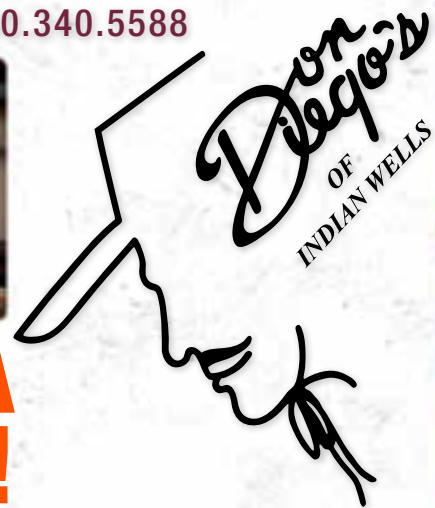

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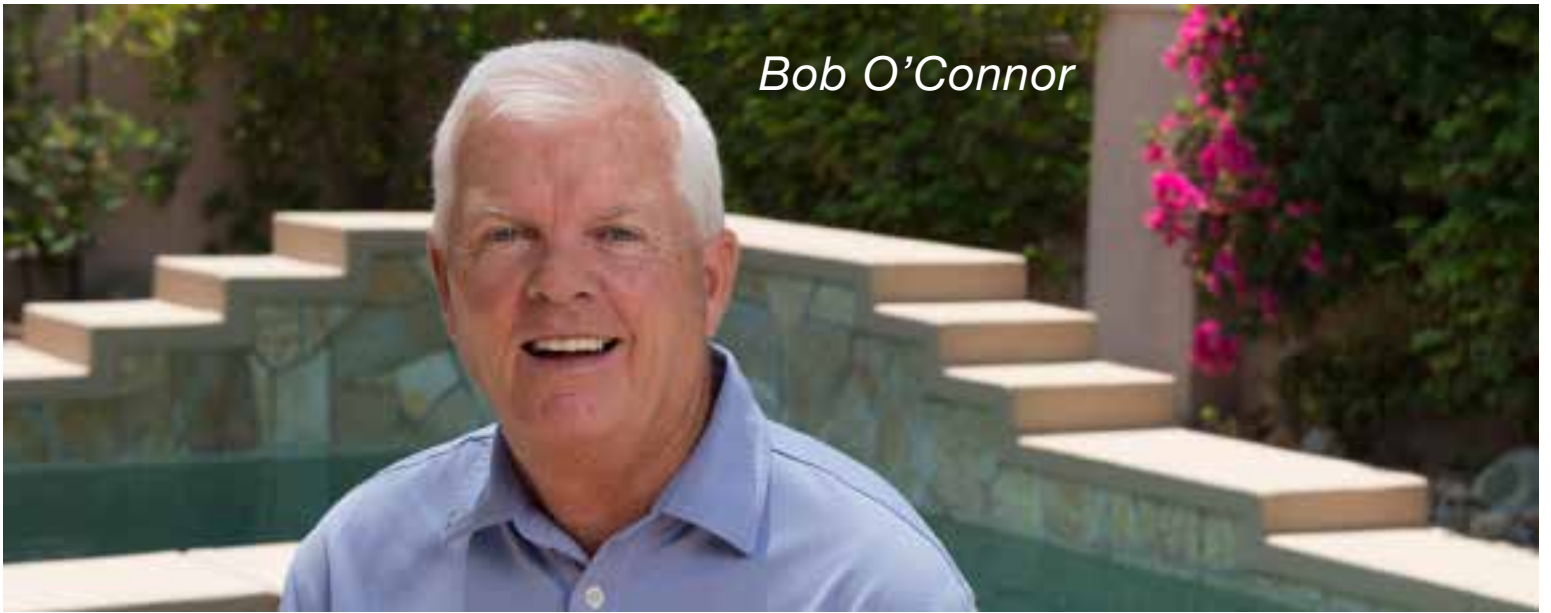
