


BNP Paribas Open Unveils Stadium 2 McEnroe Challenge for Charity presented by esurance



The Indian Wells Tennis Garden and the BNP Paribas Open will unveil its new Stadium 2 on **Saturday, March 1**

with a special event benefiting local charities. The *McEnroe Challenge for Charity presented by esurance* will feature multiple Grand Slam and/or BNP Paribas Open champions John McEnroe,



Jim Courier, Peter Fleming and Rick Leach. This one-day event will showcase the new Stadium 2 and will offer free admission. It will give 8,000 fans the opportunity to see some of history's greatest players as well as to wander the grounds and take in the spectacular site expansion that includes a beautiful new East entrance and Walk of Palms, an additional shade structure with video walls, four more practice courts and additional concessions. The highly anticipated restaurants in Stadium 2, including the renowned Nobu, will also be open for business (see side note).

The four competitors, all former World No. 1 ranked players in either singles or doubles, will bring immense talent to the court with

more than 30 Grand Slam singles and doubles championships and more than 250 ATP World Tour singles and doubles titles between them.

McEnroe will play Courier in best of three sets singles match (Super Tie-Break played for the third set), followed by McEnroe and Fleming playing Courier and Leach in a 9-game doubles pro-set. Each player and doubles team will represent a designated local charity, and 100 percent of the prize money earned — \$40,000 for singles (\$25,000 for the winner, \$15,000 for the loser) and \$40,000 for doubles (\$25,000 for the winning team, \$15,000 for the losing team) — will be donated to the charity the player is representing.

The gates will open for the event at 5:00 p.m. At approximately 6:30 p.m. a ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held on court in Stadium 2 with live entertainment and prize giveaways. Matches will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Indian Wells Strategic Planning Is in Full Swing


In December the City Council embarked on a strategic planning process to anticipate the future, envision what the City organization must become in order to operate effectively with that future, and make plans for moving the organization from what it is to what it needs to become to be successful. The City's Mission Statement is:

Create an unsurpassed quality of life for our residents and guests by providing superior public safety, exceptional service and outstanding amenities that will further enhance our image as a prestigious community.

The Council has heard presentations identifying customers, resource providers, regulators and competitors, as well as the trends affecting each of these groups. Community Development, Public Works and Marketing work plans have been discussed and specific policies evaluated. In February the Council will review the City's financial condition and fiscal policies. The two-day City Council workshop will be held February 11 and 12 at the Indian Wells Golf Resort. The workshop will feature City Council discussions regarding the major issues affecting Indian Wells and goals for the future. Residents are encouraged to participate at each of the meetings and there is a specific opportunity to raise issues and concerns. The final presentation of the City Council effort will be presented with the State of the City Address on April 17.



Vacant Lots Maintenance



If you're the owner of a vacant lot in Indian Wells, please note that the City's Code Enforcement Officer does a sweep of all lots in the city during the month of April to ensure that lots are free of weeds and sealed with a City-approved sealant. For your information, below is the Municipal Code reference:

8.08.010 Maintenance of Property—Conditions that are Nuisances

(x) Dust control on Vacant Land Not Yet Treated with One or More City Approved Dust Control Measures. "City approved dust control measures," for the purposes of this subsection include, but are not limited to, the planting and maintenance of landscape or vegetation, or a proper chemical control treatment, so as to control blowing dust from the site.

City Awards Grants to 14 Community Organizations

In 1999, the City of Indian Wells formally established the Community Assistance Program by City ordinance to support the efforts of nonprofit and community based organizations that provide diverse and needed programs to the citizens of our valley. Comprised of Indian Wells residents, the City's Grants-in-Aid Committee provides guidance to City Council regarding the distribution of charitable funding. The program currently allocates funding in the amount of \$60,000 for homeless-related activities and \$40,000 for other charitable organizations and nonprofit agencies. This winter, funding was approved for and distributed to the following Community Assistance Program recipients for fiscal year 2013-14:


