

The City of Indian Wells would like to thank Lt. Coby Webb for her service these past three years and also welcome Lt. Evan Petersen who took the reins in October. Lt. Petersen has been with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department since 1996, and has held every rank leading up to lieutenant.



Lt. Petersen started his first patrol assignment at the Jurupa Valley Station where he went on to be a corporal. ### Hedge Height Trimming Policy Modified for Summer Months

You may not be aware that the City of Indian Wells has an ordinance that limits hedge heights to a maximum of 9 feet (Indian Wells Municipal Code Section 21.50.051). However, if a violation occurs between the dates of July 1 and September 30, property owners have until the beginning of October as identified on the written Notice of Violation to come into compliance. Plants are already distressed from the summer heat and elements, so this policy is designed to keep greenery in good health year-round.

The City encourages all property owners and home occupants to always comply with the general landscaping standards laid out in the Municipal Code's Chapter 8.08.

### **Desert Horizons Country** Club Helps Conserve Our **Most Precious Resource**

Desert Horizons Country Club is currently converting its conventional PGP sprinkler system to the newer MP rotator system. This sprinkler system allows Desert Horizons to direct irrigation where most needed, and reduces run-off and water waste.

Due to the drought situation, the City continues to examine ways to save water. City representatives approached the residential club to offer conservation-oriented solutions for replacing the club's dated sprinkler system, and we commend Desert Horizons for taking this water-efficient step.

### **Upgrades to Mountain View Villas Landscape and Lighting**



The City is currently replacing dead and hazardous trees in the Mountain View Villas development with three types of citrus trees providing shade and fruit.

In addition, a revamp of the landscape lighting is underway. The City is replacing the traditional system with energy-efficient LED lighting for energy conservation, safety and aesthetics.

### **EYES UP! ENJOY THE SCENERY...**

The weather is phenomenal, the sky is blue, and all of the things that comprise the beauty of fall in Indian Wells are what draws us here. When driving around the city, take note of the palm trees, the maroon accents and street signs and, more importantly, NOT your cell phone when you are behind the wheel. Because text messages require a driver's visual, manual and cognitive attention, it is far and away the most alarming distraction when behind the wheel. Traffic collisions in Indian Wells primarily occur between the hours of 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. with driver distractions often a factor in the incidents. Statistics show five seconds is the average amount of time your eyes are off the road while texting. When traveling 50 mph, that's enough time to cover the length of a football field blindfolded.

Also, when driving on Miles Avenue west of Washington Street, I agree that it's easy to be awe-inspired by the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and foliage surrounding the venue. But when it comes time to take a family photo of the location, I and my deputies ask, please don't do it while driving! Enjoy the scenery, stop, take in the surrounding beauty of the city, and keep your EYES UP and on the road around you.

## NEW STATE LAW IMPACTS DRIVERS AND BIKERS

The City would like to remind residents that Assembly Bill 1371 (Bicycles: Passing Distance) went into effect as law on September 16, 2014. Known as the Three Feet for Safety Act, it requires a motor vehicle driver passing a bicycle proceeding in the same direction to pass with no less than three feet between any part of the vehicle and any part of the bicycle or driver. When three feet is

not possible, the motorist must slow to a reasonable and prudent speed and only pass when no danger is present to the bicyclist. Failure to do so can incur a fine, regardless of a collision or not. (Source: California Department of Motor Vehicles)

Most importantly, the IRS does not initiate contact with taxpayers by e-mail or social media to request personal or financial information. Furthermore, if you receive a scam e-mail claiming to be from the IRS, you can forward it to the IRS at phishing@irs.gov.


## Apply for Your 2015 Indian Wells Property Owner ID Card Now

### **SCE RAISES RATES 12-14%, WANTS SOLAR TARIFF**

SCE implemented a 12-14% rate increase for all customers in July. For the first time in a number of years, the increase also affected Tier 1, which is traditionally immune to rate increases.



SCE customers with solar energy systems will notice the price increase when they receive their annual billing. Annual bills will be an average of 13% higher for the portion of the year after July 1, 2014.

SCE has also applied to the PUC for permission to apply a tariff to all accounts with a solar system, claiming that it needs to recoup the costs of maintaining the transmission system. It is recommending a minimum tariff of \$10 per month per account. The PUC is considering the application and will be inviting the public to provide input before making a final decision. Any approved tariff is expected to take several years to come in effect.


