As noted in the November newsletter, the City has outlined a number of dynamic goals and action plans that it plans to achieve in the next two years. This effort is primarily focused on strengthening organization and customer service at City Hall, ensuring robust short- and long-term City finances, and continuing to build an exceptional quality of life.

The Strategic Planning process officially launches this month and will take place over the next few months leading up to a Strategic Planning workshop scheduled for February 11 and 12, 2014.

We want to emphasize that this is an inclusive process where you, as Indian Wells residents, will have ample time to weigh in with your comments prior to and at the February workshop session. Finalized goals and action plans will be presented to the community at the State of the City address on April 17, 2014

Solar Panel Plan Check and Permit Fee

The City has reduced its solar panel plan check and permit fee for residential home projects to a maximum of \$450. Those projects that do not meet the following design standards will require an engineer's letter or report showing the existing roof can support the design or added weight of the solar panels and equipment.

- O Roof load does not exceed 6.5 pounds per square foot;
- O Solar system mounting brackets are spaced no greater than 48 inches on center; and
- The maximum allowable coverage of the entire roof is not exceeded.

A Hiker's Dream


Forty years ago Coachella Valley Boy Scouts blazed The Living Desert Zoo and Botanical Garden's hiking trails to earn their badges. The Scouts created three trails winding through more than 1,000 acres of undisturbed Sonoran Desert within The Living Desert's 1,200 acres.

Hiking enthusiasts will surely find a trail that matches their fitness and experience level. The ¼ mile Inner Loop trail is the shortest and easiest. The Middle Loop trail is approximately one mile long with a gentle rise and fall as you trek the loop. At 3.5 miles long and with boulder scrambling involved, the Wilderness Loop is for more experienced hikers peaking at a covered picnic area at 1,000 feet elevation with gorgeous views of Eisenhower Mountain and the Coachella Valley.

Hikers must sign in and sign out at the trailhead. The trails are open every day, except Christmas Day, through May 31.

Since much of The Living Desert is situated in Indian Wells, you'll be exploring the pristine landscape of our exceptional city!





Need Transportation? Take a TRIP Ride

If you or someone you know is unable to drive, TRIP for Riverside County provides transportation assistance for older adults and people with disabilities throughout the county. TRIP complements public transportation by encouraging volunteer friends and neighbors to transport older adults and people with disabilities to access medical services and other needed resources.

Passengers can recruit and choose their own volunteer drivers from people they know and trust, volunteer drivers receive mileage reimbursement payments, and rides are free to passengers.

A program of SunLine Transit Agency, SunDial offers valley-wide curb-to-curb next day public transportation service designed to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

SunDial service is available seven days a week (except Thanksgiving and Christmas Day) from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

ADA Certification ID card, and one personal care attendant may travel free of charge. Service animals are always welcome; non-service animals must be properly secured in a cage/ container to travel.
