Please bring proof of Indian Wells residency. All dogs must be on leash and cats in carriers. For more information, call City Hall, (760) 346-2489.







Global Economy Focus of Next World Affairs Council Dinner

On Sunday, March 17, World Affairs Council of the Desert will present a program offering insight into the future of the global economy with featured speaker Dr. Lee E. Ohanian, one of the world's leading experts on economic growth, crises and policy.



Dr. Ohanian is a professor of economics and director of the Ettinger Family Program in Macroeconomic Research at UCLA. A senior fellow


at the Hoover Institution, he is an advisor to the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis,

and previously advised other Federal Reserve banks, foreign central banks, and the National Science Foundation. He has also served as an economic advisor to state and national political campaigns. He is a frequent media commentator and writes for the *Wall Street Journal, Forbes,* and *Investor's Business Daily*.

Dr. Ohanian is also co-director of the research initiative "Macroeconomics across Time and Space" at the National Bureau of Economic Research.

Cabot's Pueblo Museum

The Indian Wells Historic Preservation Foundation will hold its 10th Annual Spring Luncheon on Friday, March 22 at the Indian Wells Country Club. Networking begins at 11:30 followed by lunch at 12 noon.

The program will focus on Cabot's Pueblo Museum in Desert Hot Springs, a top Valley attraction celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. Museum Director Ginger Ridgway will speak about the Museum's offerings and history.

Intrepid pioneer and traveler Cabot Yerxa built the Museum, a Hopi-inspired multi-level pueblo that includes 35 rooms, 150 windows, and 65 doors all crafted from found materials. The facility houses many early 1900's artifacts including Yerxa's collection of Native American pottery.

All members and friends of historic preservation are welcome to attend. Cost is \$35 per person. Reservations are due by March 19.




