

as a bombsight mechanic/armorer assigned to the 848th Bomb Squad.



After the war, Dr. Barton earned his bachelor's degree at Temple University. He went on to obtain his Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (DPM) degree and enjoyed a successful forty-year career in his profession. Now retired, Dr. Barton remains active in professional groups, and has served as treasurer of the Foundation for Excellence in Podiatric Medicine for more than two decades.

Since relocating to Indian Wells full-time in 1990, he continues to donate his time as a volunteer for many organizations, including his role as vice president of Collectors Corner operated by the Eisenhower Medical Center Auxiliary and as a McCallum Theatre usher.

The father of three grown daughters and grandfather of three is an inspiration to all who cross his path. Dr. Barton's advice to the younger generation? ### Housing Element Update

The City of Indian Wells is updating its Housing Element, which establishes City policies and programs related to housing through 2021. The Housing Element is one of the seven state-mandated elements of the City's General Plan and provides the framework to address the existing and projected housing needs of all members of our community.

A draft Housing Element will be developed in summer 2013 and is anticipated to be reviewed by the Planning Commission and City Council for adoption in fall 2013. The City hosted a community workshop on April 16 to provide information about the Housing Element and receive input from residents and others community members.

If you were unable to attend the community workshop, or would like to stay involved in the Housing Element update, please join us at a joint workshop of the City Council and Planning Commission scheduled for Thursday, May 16 at 4 p.m. in City Hall Council Chambers. At that time, City Council and the Planning Commission will be hearing an informational presentation about the Housing Element Update and discussing potential future directions for housing in Indian Wells.

### City Offers Free Vacation Home Checks

Are you leaving town for the season or have a summer getaway planned? Before you leave, be sure to register in person at City Hall for a Vacation Home Check. You can also take a proactive role in deterring crime by doing the following:

Stopping mail and newspaper delivery, and having someone you trust check for unscheduled deliveries.

Placing valuables in a safe location, locking all doors and windows, setting burglar alarm and placing shims in trackways.

Keeping your lawn cut and shrubbery trimmed to avoid signaling your absence.

ℍ Installing motion-activated lights throughout the exterior of your home, and putting interior lights on timers to simulate that someone is home.

8→ Letting your neighbors know you are away so that they can call 911 or the Sheriff's Department toll-free non-emergency number at (800) 950-2444 if they see or hear anything suspicious or unusual.
