World Affairs Council Dinner to Focus on Iran

There is perhaps no one more qualified to speak about the challenges of Iran than Stanford University's Director of Iranian Studies Dr. Abbas Milani. Also Co-Director of the Iran Democracy Project at the Hoover Institution, Dr. Milani will be the featured speaker at the next World Affairs Council of the Desert dinner program to he held on Sunday, March 25 at the Renaissance Esmeralda Resort and Spa.


Originally from Iran, Dr. Milani continued his studies in the West, receiving his BA in political science and economics from the University of California at Berkeley and his PhD in political science from the University of Hawaii in 1974. He returned to Iran to serve as an assistant professor of political science at the National University in Tehran from 1975 to 1977. In 1977, he was imprisoned by the shah's regime for suspected ties with dissidents. After his release, he continued teaching at Tehran University before immigrating to the United States in 1986.

Dr. Milani is the author of several books, including

Eminent Persians: Men and Women Who Made Modern Iran, and The Riddle of the Iranian Revolution. He is a member of the American Association of Political Science, member of the board of directors for ISG (Iranian Studies Group at MIT), and the Association of Iranian Studies.

The World Affairs Council of the Desert speaker series is open to the public and begins with a 5 p.m. reception, followed by a 6 p.m. dinner, speaker presentation, and Q&A session. Cost is \$55 for members. \$65 for non-members.
