




# Join Us for Tee and Play Fore Fun


# The Most Beautiful Arias in Indian Wells





## Precautions to Ensure Your Personal Safety

Make your personal safety a priority and lower your risk of becoming a victim of a crime by following a number of prudent measures while you are out and about:

- Be alert and aware of your surroundings and the people around you, especially if you are alone or it is dark. If possible, travel with a friend and stay in well-lighted areas.
- Walk close to the curb, and avoid doorways, bushes and alleys where someone could hide. Walk confidently, at a steady pace, and make eye contact with people while walking. Do not respond to a stranger's conversation; keep walking.
- If you carry a purse, hold it securely between your arm and your body.
- Park in well-lighted areas. Always lock car doors after entering or leaving your car, have your car keys at hand, and always check the back seat before entering your car.
- If you think you are being followed, drive to a public place.
- If your car breaks down, open the hood and attach a white cloth to the car antenna. If someone stops to help, stay in the locked car, roll down the window a little, and ask them to call a tow service.
- Don't stop to aid motorists stopped on the side of the road. Go to a phone and request help for them.

If you or someone near you is a victim of a crime, report it! In many cases, it is the information provided by victims and witnesses that leads to the arrest of a criminal.

Disposing of Standing Water Can Help Eliminate West Nile Virus

Winter rainfall in the desert is a welcome event for our thirsty water supply and plants, but rain can also fill up areas prone to standing water that support mosquito breeding. Residential sources of standing water can produce a significant number of mosquitoes throughout the Coachella Valley. You can help alleviate this problem by:

• Emptying water out of containers such as flower pots, buckets, tires, bird baths, and pet dishes.

> Pet dishes: Rinse and fill with fresh water one to two times a week.

Potted plant dishes: Flush out saucer with a hose or drill holes in the bottom to allow for better drainage.

Bird baths and buckets: Clean or hose bird baths weekly; keep buckets upside down or empty water weekly.

Drains: Ensure that drains are flowing freely.

- Reporting swimming pools and ornamental ponds that are not being maintained, and keeping ornamental ponds and neglected pools free of excess vegetation.
- Contacting the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District for free mosquitofish to place in your ornamental ponds, neglected pools, or any other container with standing water that can potentially breed mosquitoes.

The District continues extensive surveillance,
