BNP PARIBAS OPEN CELEBRATES ITS 35TH ANNIVERSARY

Players to Watch March 8-21

The BNP Paribas Open is right around the corner, bringing more than 300 of the world's most talented tennis players to the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The complimentary tournament tickets that city residents receive for Residents' Day (March 11) and other dates throughout the tournament is one of the great benefits of Indian Wells property ownership and, by now, most of you will have picked up your tickets at City Hall.

- 1. Roger Federer: The World № 1 player, and three-time BNP Paribas Open champion, had an incredible year in 2009. He surpassed Pete Sampras' mark of Grand Slam titles by capturing his first French Open title and following that up with his sixth Wimbledon title just a month later.
- 2. Maria Sharapova: One of the most-recognized athletes in the world, this Russian starlet returned from shoulder surgery in 2009 by playing doubles at the BNP Paribas Open. She went on to reclaim her form throughout the season and won her 20th career singles title at Tokyo. In addition, she reached the quarterfinals at the French Open and the semifinals of two other events.
- **3. Rafael Nadal:** The World №. 2 Spaniard is the defending men's champion of the BNP Paribas Open. In 2009 he captured the Australian Open, but injuries in the second

- half of the year derailed him from maintaining the N° . 1 ranking with which he began the year. He came back at the end of the year to help his country capture another Davis Cup title, the second in as many years.
- 4. Kim Clijsters: The new mom made an incredible comeback to the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour last year. After taking more than two years off, she burst back onto the scene, and in her third tournament she captured the US Open title and her second career major. The two-time BNP Paribas Open champion will want to make it a trifecta in March.
- **5. Novak Djokovic:** The 2008 BNP Paribas Open champion won five titles in 2005, including three events in the fall swing at the end of the season. The World № 3 is always entertaining to fans, and will be looking to hoist the trophy on center court again this year.





- **6–9. Dinara Safina, Svetlana Kuznetsova, Elena Dementieva and Vera Zvonareva:** This quartet of Russians are all ranked in the top ten, and have been dominant performers on the Tour the past few years.
- **10. Andy Roddick:** The American played one of the greatest matches of his career at Wimbledon in 2009 before falling to Federer 16-14 in the fifth set. A semifinalist here last year, and a first-time doubles champion (with Mardy Fish) he captured the 28th title of his career at Brisbane in the first week of the 2010 season.
- **11. Caroline Wozniacki:** This 19-year-old made tremendous strides in 2009 winning three titles and reaching the finals at the U.S. Open to catapult her to a career-high ranking of №. 4 in the world.
- **12. Andy Murray:** A BNP Paribas Open finalist last year, the Scot captured an ATP World Tour-best six titles in 2009 and reached a career-high №. 2 ranking in August before finishing №. 4. Last year, he also reached the semifinals at Wimbledon and the quarterfinals at the French Open. His all-court game makes him a threat to capture his first title in the desert this year.
- **13. Victoria Azarenka:** A BNP Paribas Open semi-finalist last year, the World №. 7 left her mark on the Tour last season by capturing three titles, including a victory in Miami the week after Indian Wells. She also won the doubles title at the BNP Paribas Open last year, with Zvonareva, who defeated her in the singles final.
- **14. Juan Martin Del Potro:** The 6' 6", 21-year-old Argentine defeated Federer in five incredible sets, at the U.S. Open last summer, to win his first major title. Unquestionably one of the brightest young stars on tour, he will be looking to collect his first Masters 1000 title in Indian Wells.
- **15. Melanie Oudin:** This 18-year-old captured the hearts of fans with her dramatic run to the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open last summer. She will be looking to make a similar run here in the desert this spring.
- **16. Bryan Brothers:** The twin brothers, Mike and Bob, are one of the greatest doubles teams of all time, yet the one win still lacking from their resume of 56 career titles is the BNP Paribas Open.
- **17. Daniela Hantuchova:** The 2002 and 2007 BNP Paribas Open champion is always a threat in Indian Wells. Unquestionably one of her favorite tournaments on tour, the Slovakian star always seems to bring her "A" game to Indian Wells.
- **18-19. Sam Querrey and John Isner:** The future of American men's tennis comes in one size tall. Querrey at 6' 6" and Isner at a towering 6' 9" both pack gigantic serves, but have proved that they are more than just missile launchers. Querrey won in Los Angeles last summer and Isner won the first ATP World Tour title of his career at Auckland.
- **20-21. Ana Ivanovic and Jelena Jankovic:** This Serbian duo had some struggles in 2009, but bright things still lie ahead for the young stars. Ivanovic, who won the BNP Paribas Open in 2008 and the French Open that year as well, is a fan favorite. Jankovic, currently ranked № 8 in the world, won two tournaments last season.


Newt Gingrich Winds Up 2010 Desert Town Hall–Indian Wells



City Residents Donate Stearman to Palm Springs Air Museum

Indian Wells residents Wayne and Laura Hoffman have donated a fully restored, two-seater 1943 Stearman biplane to the Palm Springs Art Museum. During the 1930s and 1940s, the plane was used as a military trainer. More than 10,000 were built by the end of World War II, and reportedly 1,000 are still flying today.

Wayne's love affair with planes started at an early age. A World War II veteran, he co-founded Flying Tigers International, an expedited global airfreight service, serving as Chairman of the Board for 20 years. The company was eventually sold to Fed Ex.

The Hoffmans own Pacific Executive Aviation, a "fixed base" operation in Ramona near San Diego, where they service all San Diego fire fighter aircraft, as well as private planes.
